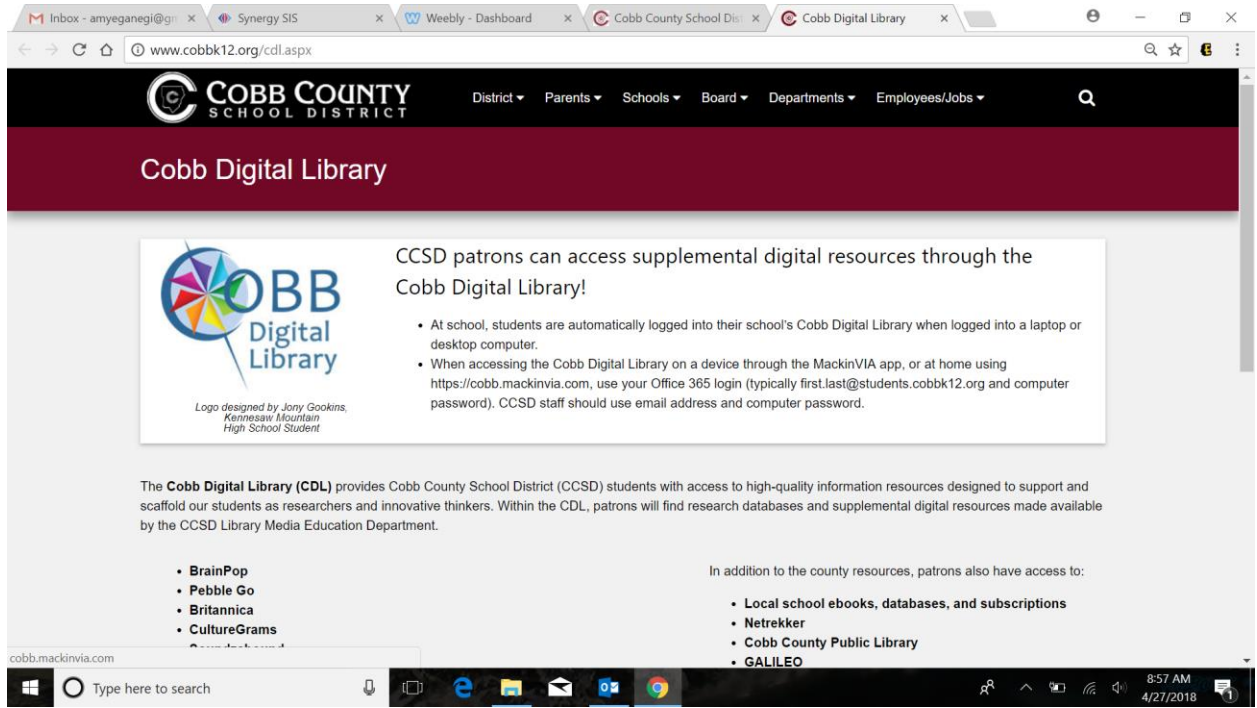


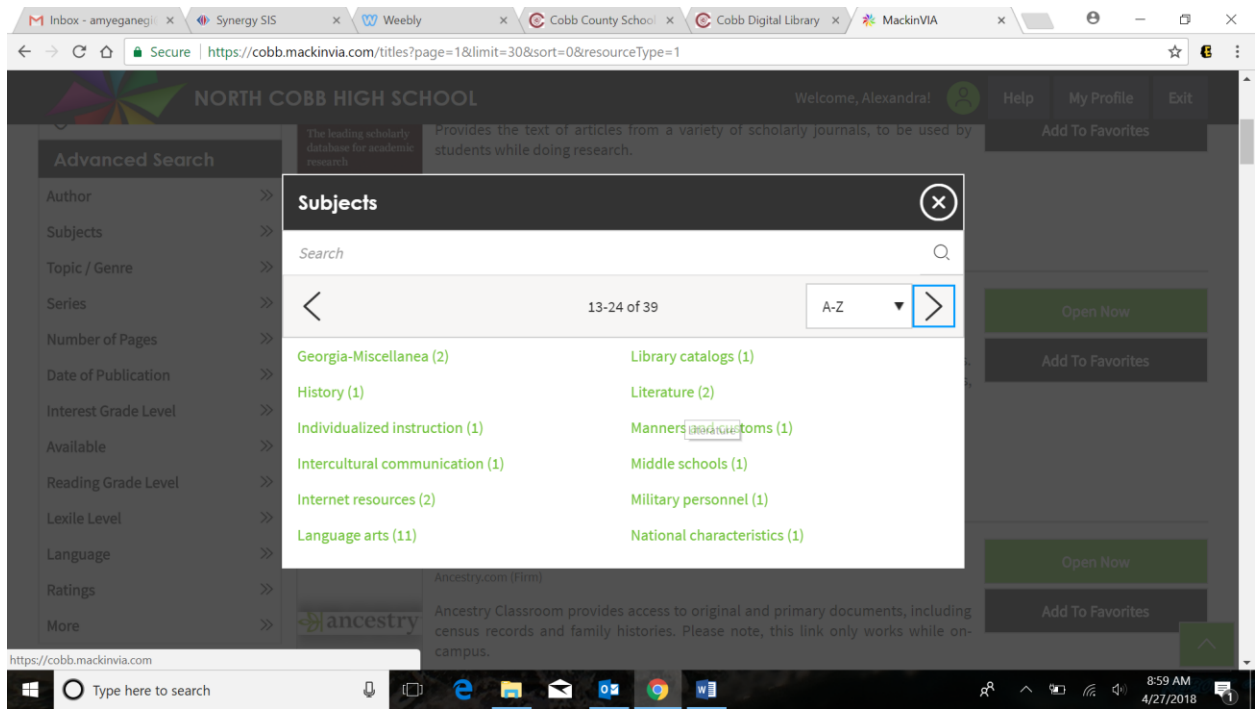
Go to the Cobb Digital Library. It may be accessed by searching for that on the cobbk12 website. Then click on the icon.

## Open the Literature Resource Center (second option).
